- **No late entries will be accepted.** A separate entry form must be used for each section entered. No exhibit can be entered in more than one class. Each entry must be the work of the individual exhibitor. No factory goods allowed. Unfinished work is not eligible.
- Where there is only one entry in a class, a prize will only be awarded if the Judge in that Section considers the exhibit worthy of such prize.
- Champion Ribbon and Card will be awarded only at the Judge's discretion in each section.
- No work that has won a First Prize at a previous Dungog Show will be eligible for competition.
- After delivering entries to the Steward, exhibitors must not remove exhibits without the Stewards permission or knowledge.
